

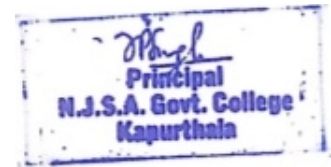

It uses non-numerical data (text, images, and observations) and uses methods like: interviews, focus groups, case studies and content analysis. It uses numerical data (statistics, surveys, experiments). The methods used in it surveys and experiments. Its goal is to test hypotheses, predict outcomes, and generalize findings.
